

TWENTY-FIVE GIFTS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

The Greek word for grace is charis. The Greek word for gifts is from the same root. The Greek for gifts is charisma. Literally translated, the word means grace-gifts, or gifts of grace. The idea is to be graced by god to perform a certain function.

I. Salvation Gifts

- A. Righteousness Rom. 5:15-17
- B. Eternal Life Rom. 6:23

II. Nine-fold Manifestations

A. Revelation Gifts (having the mind of God)

- 1. Word of wisdom I Cor. 12:8
- 2. Word of knowledge I Cor. 12:8
- 3. Discerning of spirits I Cor. 12:10

B. Vocal Gifts (the mouth of God or God speaking)

- 1. Tongues I Cor. 12:10, 28
- 2. Interpretation of tongues I Cor. 12:10
- 3. Prophecy I Cor. 12:10, Rom. 12:6

C. Power Gifts (the arm or hand of God extended)

- 1. Faith I Cor. 12:9
- 2. Gifts of healings I Cor. 12:9
- 3. Miracles I Cor. 12:10, 28

III. Ministry Gifts

- A. Apostle I Cor. 12:28, Eph. 4:7-11
- B. Prophet I Cor. 12:30, Eph. 4:7-11
- C. Evangelist Eph. 4:7-11
- D. Pastor (shepherd) I Cor. 12:28, Eph. 4:7-11
- E. Teacher Eph. 4:7-11, Rom. 12:7

IV. Supportive Gifts

- A. Office of serving Rom. 12:7 (deaconship)
- B. Giving Rom. 12:8
- C. Showing mercy Rom. 12:8
- D. Exhortation Rom. 12:8 (one who warns, encourages, comforts, cheers, aids)
- E. Helps I Cor. 12:28

V. Gifts of Leadership

- A. Ruling Rom. 12:8 (leading) (Greek--one who takes the lead: leadership)
- B. Government I Cor. 12:28 (steering) (Greek--to steer, pilot, or direct)

VI. Celibacy/Marriage I Cor. 7:7

VII. Intercessory Prayer II Cor. 1:9-11 (supernatural, miraculous intervention because of prayer)

See also the following passages: Romans 1:11, I Corinthians 1:7, Romans 11:29, I Timothy 4:14, II Timothy 1:6, I Peter 4:10. These passages are very interesting and include other occurrences of the word charisma in the Greek New Testament. (See also Proverbs 18:16.)
